Defence need: So 100m cut in Plan

SINGAPORE, July 22.—The Central Government is to slash the Second Five-Year Plan by about 100 million dollars to meet defence commitments.

As a result of defence agreements, the Minister for Defence, Mr. Tan Seng Ewe, said.

National Development Planning Committee is taking the early development programme to meet the rising defence build-up.

Mr. Tan said the defence force will need money to build up defence. This will leave the Five-Year Plan with a gap of 100 million dollars.

Any way to get the money will be to raise about 100 million from the Government's own plan when other plans are cut.




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
