

CHAPTER 3

RESULTS: SOCIO – ECONOMIC STATUS OF THE POPULATION INVESTIGATED IN THE FOUR VILLAGES

3.1 Kampung Tok Junuh

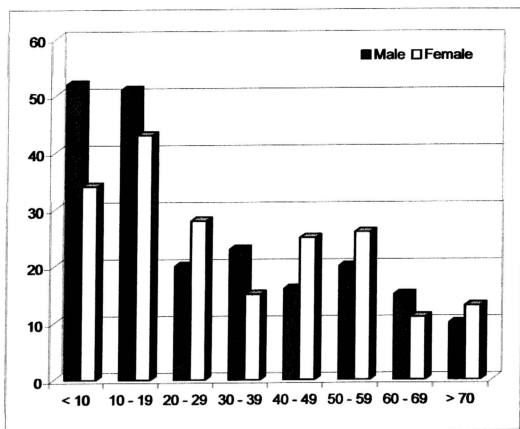


Figure 3.1.1: Sex Distribution Pattern of Kampung Tok Junuh Population according to Age Groups

The total population of the village was determined to be 455 (94 Households) with 229 males and 226 females but only 403 from 84 households (208 males and 195 females) were interviewed. The sex distribution pattern according to age groups of the population surveyed is shown in Table 3.1.1 and Figure 3.1.1.

From Table 3.1.1 it can be seen that the male population is slightly higher than the female. It was found that 44.8 per cent (180) of the population are below 20 years of age with 21.4 per cent (86) of the population less than 10 years old, while only 12.2 per cent (49) of the population are above 60 years old.

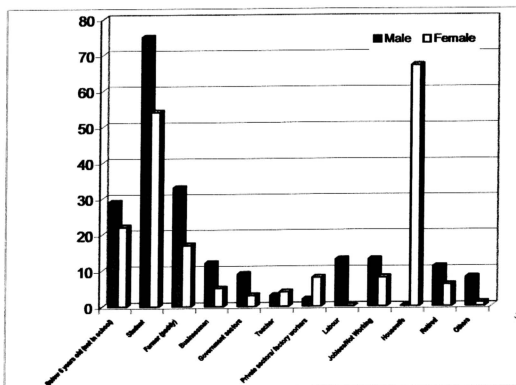


Figure 3.1.2: Occupation Distribution Pattern of Kampung Tok Junuh according to Sex

Table 3.1.2 and Figure 3.1.2 show the sex distribution pattern of the population according to occupation and Table 3.1.3 shows the occupation distribution pattern of the villagers according to age groups. It was found that only 12.4 per cent (50) of the population are paddy field farmers and 70.8 per cent are not working which include, children below 6 years old, students, retired workers and housewives (Table 3.1.2). The majority of the male population are students (36.0 per cent) and paddy field farmers (15.9 per cent) whereas the majority of the female population are housewives (34.1 per cent) and students (27.7 per cent). Table 3.1.3 shows that the majority of the working groups or income generating population are between 20 years old to less than 60 years old.

3.2 Kampung Alor Bakat

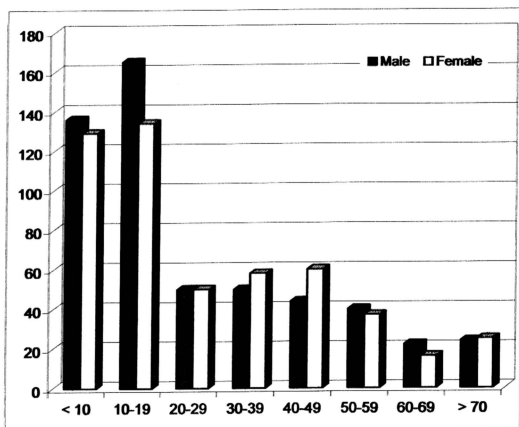


Figure 3.2.1: The Sex Distribution Pattern of the Population of Kampung Alor Bakat According to Age-Groups

The total population of the village was found to be 1295 (265 households) with 630 males and 665 females but only 1041 from 176 households (531 males and 510 females) were interviewed. Table 3.2.1 and Figure 3.2.1 show the sex distribution pattern of the population surveyed according to different age groups. Table 3.2.1 shows that the male population was found to be slightly higher than the female population in almost all age groups. It was also found that 54.3 per cent (564) of the population are below 20 years old and 25.5 per cent (265) below 10 years old (Table 3.2.1). From the same table it can also be seen that only 8.4 per cent (87) of the population are above 60 years old.

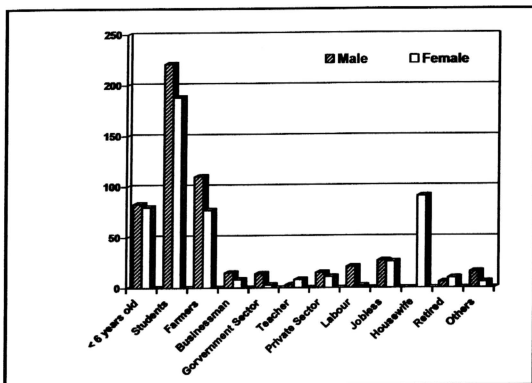


Figure 3.2.2: Occupation Distribution Pattern of the Population of Kampung Alor Bakat According to Sex

Table 3.2.2 and Figure 3.2.2 show the occupation distribution pattern of the villagers according to sex and Table 3.2.3 shows the occupation distribution pattern of the villagers according to age groups. Table 3.2.2 shows that only 18.0 per cent (187) of the population are paddy field farmers and the majority of the population (70.3 per cent) can be categorized as non-working which include those below 6 years old, students, retired workers and housewives. As with Tok Junuh the population distribution of Alor Bakat also shows that the majority of the male population consists of students (41.6 per cent) and paddy field farmers (20.7 per cent), whereas the female population are mainly students (36.9 per cent), housewives (17.6 per cent) and paddy field farmers (15.1 per cent). Table 3.2.3 shows that the majority of the working population are between 20 years old to less than 60 years old.

3.3 Kampung Serdang Muda

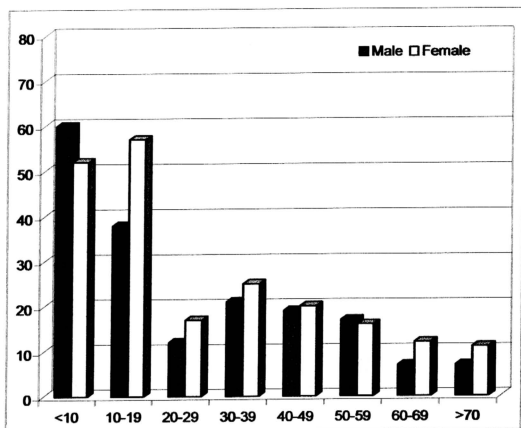


Figure 3.3.1: The Sex Distribution Pattern of the Population of Kampung Serdang Muda According to Age-Groups

The population of Kampung Serdang Muda consisted of 391 participants (76 households) with 181 male and 210 female. The sex distribution pattern of the population according to age groups is shown in Table 3.3.1 and Figure 3.3.1. Table 3.3.2 shows that the female population is higher than the male population. The female population is higher in all age groups except in the group between 10 to less than 20 years old and age 50 to less than 60 years old. More than half of the population 52.9 per cent (207) is below 20 years old with 28.6 per cent (112) less than 10 years old(Table 3.3.1) while only 9.5 per cent (37) of the population is above 60 years old.

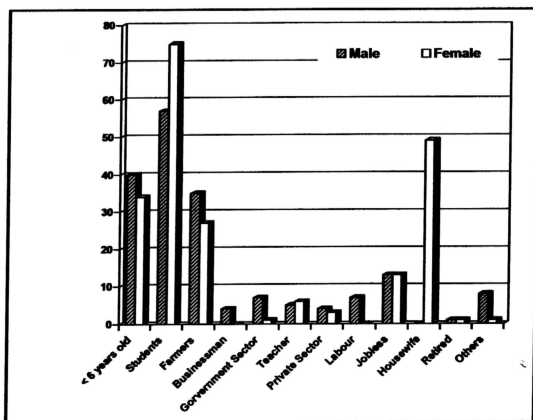


Figure 3.3.2: Occupation Distribution Pattern of the Population of Kampung Serdang Muda According to Sex

Table 3.3.2 and Figure 3.3.2 show the occupation distribution pattern of the villagers according to sex and Table 3.3.3 show the occupation distribution pattern of the population according to age groups. It was found that only 15.9 per cent (62) of the population are paddy field farmers and like the previous two villages, the majority of the population (72.3 per cent) are non-working (children below 6 years old, students, retired workers and housewives) (Table 3.3.2). The majority of the male population like the others two villages are also mainly students (31.5 per cent) and paddy field farmers (19.3 per cent) while the majority of the female population are students (35.7 per cent) and housewives (23.3 per cent). Table 3.3.3 shows that the major income generation age group is between 20 years old to less than 60 years old.

3.4 Kampung Serdang Surau (Serdang Tua)

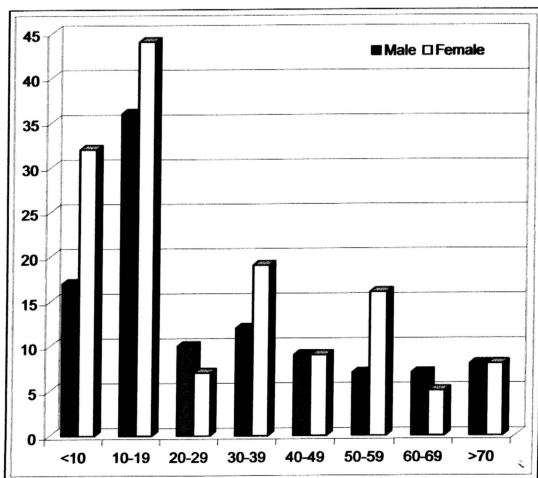


Figure 3.4.1: The Sex Distribution Pattern of the Population of Kampung Serdang Surau According to Age-Groups

The interview was conducted on 48 out of 56 households. The total population of the village is 266 (56 households) with 119 males and 147 females and only 92.48 per cent (48 households) were interviewed which comprised of 246 villagers (106 males and 140 females). The sex distribution pattern according to the different age groups versus age groups is shown in Table 3.4.1 and Figure 3.4.1. It is found that like Kampung Serdang Muda, Kampung Serdang Surau also has a higher female population (Table 3.4.1). It was found that 52.4 per cent (129) of the population are below 20 years old, with 19.9 per cent (49) are 10 years old or below, while 16.6 per cent (39) of the population are above 60 years old.

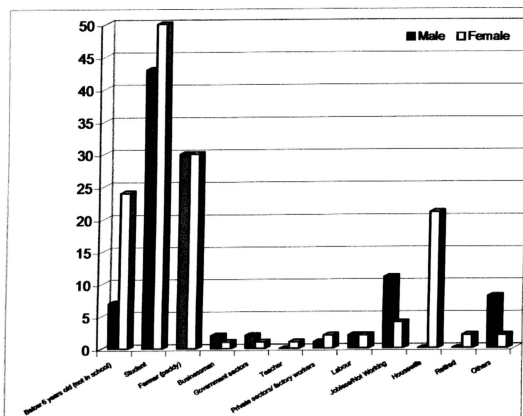


Figure 3.4.2: Occupation Distribution Pattern of the population of Kampung Serdang Surau according to Sex

3.5 Socio – Economic Status of the Four Villages

From data presented in Sections 3.1 to 3.4 on the villages, socio-economic environment of the study site can be summarized in Tables 3.5.1 to 3.5.3. Table 3.5.1 shows the overall population of the 4 villages according to sex and age groups. The female population is slightly higher than the male population but they are spread evenly throughout the age group, and there is not much difference in the sex ratio of the population. As previously mentioned, in each of the four villages the majority of the population is under 20 years old, that is 51.9 per cent (1046) while only 9.7 per cent (201) of the population are above 60 years old.

Table 3.5.2 shows that 70.3 per cent (1462) of the population are non-working and comprises of children below 6 years old, students, the jobless, retired workers and housewives and the remaining 17.3 per cent (359) are paddy field farmers. Table 3.5.3 shows the occupation distribution pattern of the population according to the different age groups.
