The University of Malaya and the Rukun Tetangga Committee have set up a pilot community centre in Section 17, Petaling Jaya. The main aim of the centre is to promote a self-sustaining and on-going programme at community level that utilises the resources of older persons, with participation from the young, for the benefit of all residents. The emphasis is on action-oriented programmes such as economic, educational, health, social, cultural, sporting and recreational activities and services. The community centre is a pilot project implemented as part of an on-going IRPA Research project "Socio-Economic Support and Community Services for the Elderly in Malaysia" that is being carried out by Professor Dr. Tan Poo Chang and her research team from the Faculty of Economics and Administration, University of Malaya, together with the cooperation of government agencies and non-governmental organizations. It was launched by Y.B. Mr. Donald Lim Siang Chai, Member of Parliament South Petaling Jaya, in September 1996.

Statistics from the 1991 Census indicated that there were 1.5 million persons of age 55 years and over in the country. By the year 2000, this group will increase to approximately 2.1 million, that is, about 9.3 per cent of the population of Malaysia. There is hence tremendous scope in utilising the talents and abilities of older persons in carrying out significant social development programmes at the local level. Although these older persons have the time, knowledge, experience and energy, their valuable resources are currently under-utilised. Thus, the setting up of the community centre is aimed at harnessing the talents and abilities of this segment of the population to assist others in the community. Once fully functional, the community centre can then act as the coordination and management centre to assist in the identification of target groups and beneficiaries, and to respond to the needs of vulnerable groups through direct

action or referral to other agencies. The community centre will also act as the main resource centre for all family members to meet their social, recreational and (to a certain extent) economic needs. Eventually, a family crisis assistance group will provide home visits for those too weak or sick to leave home, and the community centre will become a first point of reference when family members have no one else to turn to.

The setting up of Community Centres usually start with either members of the public/agencies contacting the Coordinators or Members of the Steering/Technical committees. A number of meetings are then held to discuss ways to set up the Community Centre. The set-up uses available infrastructure and agencies and activities are determined by the local committee. A new Community Centre usually starts with only one or two activities which are run by available coordinators in each centre.

The community centre is also aimed at promoting neighbourhood participation to bring about social cohesion and promote unity. The centre is managed by a committee together with the Rukun Tetangga Committee Members and the funds generated are used for planning and implementation of future programmes and activities. The office of the community centre is located at Rukun Tetangga 17A, Jalan 17/31, 46400 Petaling Jaya, but activities are also conducted at Rukun Tetangga 17C, Jalan 17/12, Balai Raya, Jalan 17/1A, and at other available facilities within the area (refer to the notice boards at the two bases at Jalan 17/31 and 17/12 for the time and venue).

Various activities (a list is enclosed) have commenced and participants of all ages are welcomed. Contribution and donations from the public (individuals and companies), as well as the initial funding from IRPA, have been utilized to launch the activities of the community centre. The community centre at Rukun Tetangga 17A is now equipped with facilities such as a television, a video recorder, a medical examination couch, a ping-pong table, board games, badminton court, a small air-conditioned computer room, and a collection of reading materials. The Majlis Perbandaran Petaling Jaya (MPPJ) is currently carrying out works to improve the surroundings of both Rukun Tetangga 17A and 17C as well as to facilitate easy access to the community centre. The Urban Services Department has also given the undertaking that they will also facilitate the community centre in keeping the area clean. A meeting was held with the police of Damansara Police Station to improve the security in the area and, to promote better relations, some joint activities are being planned. The Rukun Tetangga base at Jalan 17/12 is being used as a collection centre which is opened every Wednesday and Saturday from 4.00 – 7.00 p.m. for collection of recyclable materials such as old newspaper, paper, aluminium and tin cans, wearable clothing, plastic, glass bottles and other items such as furniture and toys which can still be used. Some of the items collected are sold at a "Flea Market" held every Sunday from 10.00 a.m. - 5.00 p.m. at Amcorp Mall, 18 Jalan Persiaran Barat, Petaling Jaya. Plans are underway to build a basket-ball court with the financial assistance of the Ministry of Youth and Sports and MPPJ. A fellowship night is

conducted at the Balai Raya, Jalan 17/1A Petaling Jaya, at 8.00-10.00 p.m. every Saturday. On every Tuesday night at 7.30 p.m.- 12.00 midnight, another fellowship night is held at Amcorp Mall. The Community Centre has also started "Waitankung" classes at the Balai Raya on every Monday and Friday from 8.00 - 9.00 p.m. The official opening of the Waitankung Club was held on 25 July 1997 and this opening was officiated by Y.B. Ir. Donald Lim Siang Chai.

The community centre is opened to all, irrespective of their socio-economic status. A schedule of on-going activities, such as language classes (English, Bahasa Malaysia, Mandarin and Japanese), tai-chi class, social dancing, fun club, table-tennis and badminton coaching classes etc., is listed on the notice boards of both bases at Jalan 17/31 and Jalan 17/12. From time to time, special activities such as talks, medical check-up and specialized courses are conducted. The community centre is presently opened at fixed hours every day for registration of participants and the implementation of various activities (see schedule below):
