The Interactional Labour Organisation has developed into a world-body rependials for the Invalidation of universal labour standards. Those standards have become guide posts to the service nutionaln the drafting of their nutional labour laws. This scadenic exercise is an attempt to compare the labour ordinances of dalays with those international standards set by the International Labour Organisation.

The field of study has been divided into seven chapters. The introductory chapter sets cut, in broad terms, the objective of this exercise and, further, presents the latter's scope and limitations.

Chapter II which follows the introduction, provides a general background to the International Labour Organisation. Events leading to the formation of the Organisation, its aims and its functions are the main sections that are covered in the chapter.

As Conventions of the world body form the basis of this exercise, a brief survey of its characteristics is presented early in the exercise, as Chapter III.

The term "industrial relations" has been used here to refer to the freedom of association and industrial action of trade unions and the dispute-settling machineries.available. These form the theme of Chapter IV.

This is followed by a chapter entitled "General conditions of Labour" and it makes a study of the international and national labour standards ontwo basic issues of labour, namely, wages and hours of work.

Chapter VI takes up, at length, the question of workers' safety, security and welfare in industry. The existing provisions guaranteeing the security of workers, measures adapted to ensure the safety of workers at their work places and the standard of welfare and compensation for industrial accidents are the chief topics discussed in the chapter.

The concluding chapter recapitulates the issues considered in the proceeding chapters and picks up the main observations made on them. A Comparative Study of
