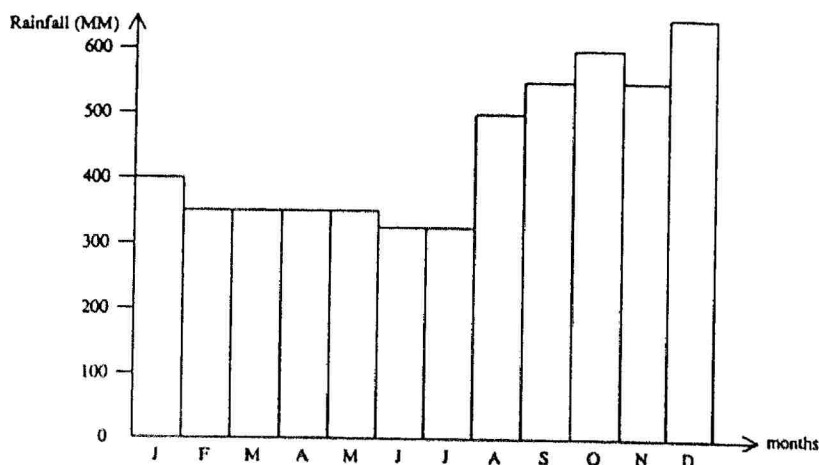

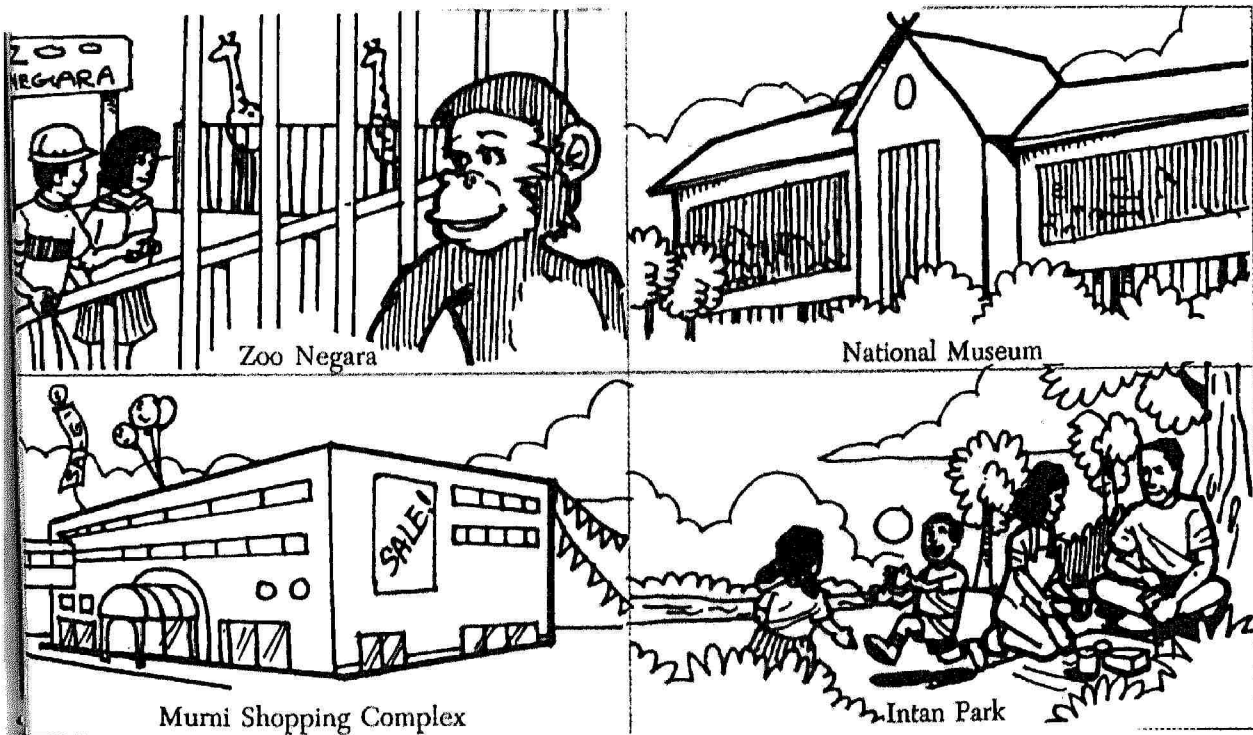

Like all other birds the young chick takes in oxygen through its blood vessel and exhales carbon dioxide. An egg shell is extremely porous allowing these gases to pass through.

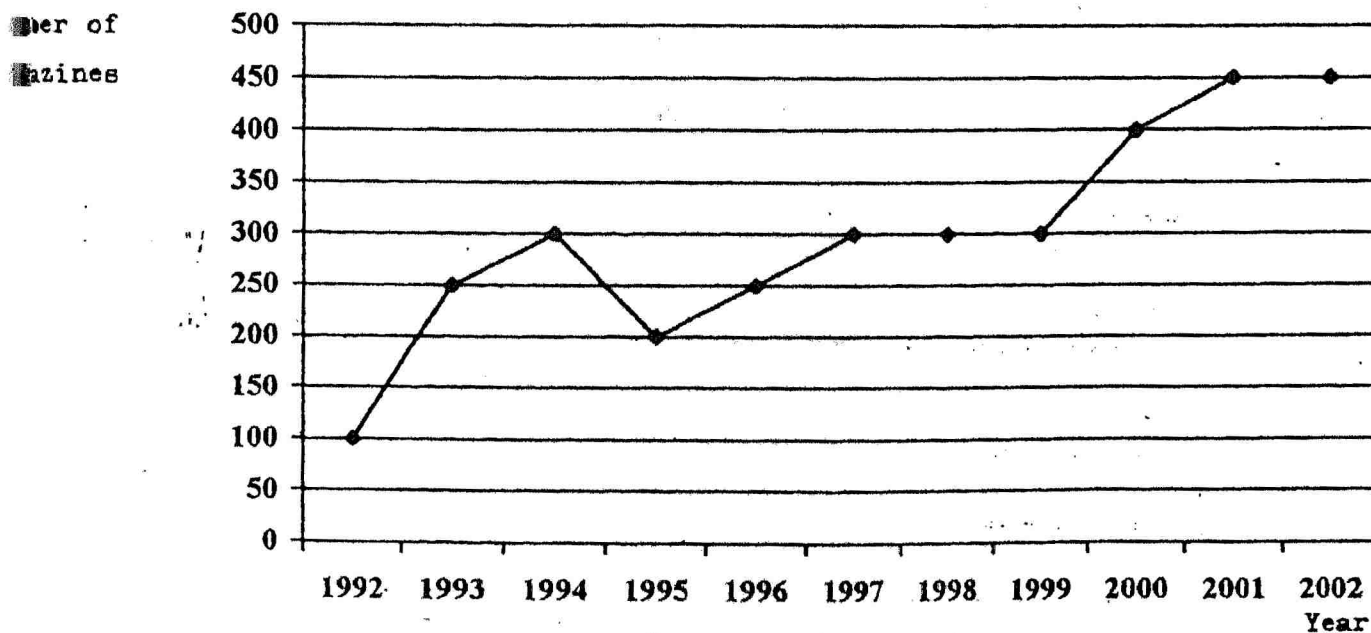

What is first aid? Basically, it means what a passer-by can do to help someone who has been injured or sick while waiting for medical help to arrive. You do not have to be a doctor or possess a degree in medicine to be able to do this. You only need to know few important steps in giving first aid.

The purpose of first aid is simple – to keep the person alive. Often there are no doctors around when emergencies happen. Passers-by may be the only ones available to help the victim. Thus, a knowledge of first aid could make the difference between life and death.

Emergency first aid is necessary in cases such as severe injuries due to falls or accidents, uncontrolled bleeding, choking that causes breathing difficulties, loss of consciousness and drug overdose. Ideally, you should take classes in first aid procedures in order for you to be an expert first-aider. However, in emergencies, any person, trained or otherwise, should give help to victims who might otherwise die.

Mouth-to-mouth resuscitation is one aid procedure that can be useful for us to know. It is also called, “**the kiss of life**”. It is given to persons who have stopped breathing. To do this you have to lay the victim on a firm surface. Tilt the head back while lifting up the chin. This is done to straighten the airway. Next, open the victim’s mouth and remove anything that may be in it. Then pinch the nose shut, take a deep breath and put your mouth over the victim’s mouth. Blow strongly into the victim’s mouth twice. Always check to see if the chest rises. If it does not, it means no air is getting into the lungs. Check again to make sure the head is tilted properly and the nose of the victim is shut. After that, continue to blow strongly and steadily into the mouth once every five seconds. Do not stop until the person resumes breathing or medical help arrives.

Knowledge of first aid may seem unimportant and unnecessary. On the contrary, it could save a person’s life.

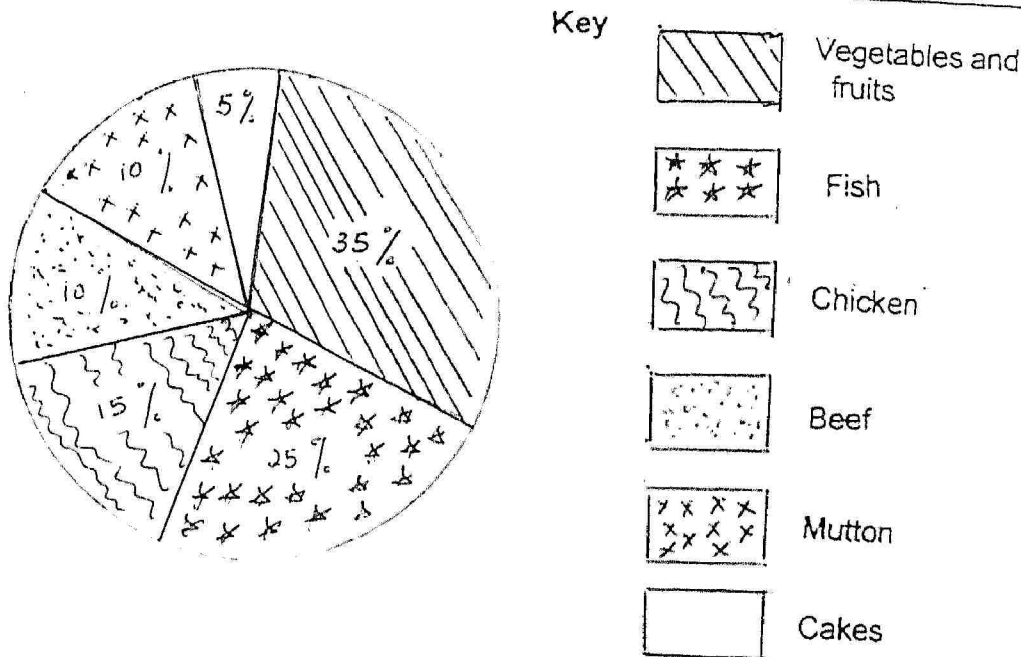
